LEVELS AND TIME LIMITS

Elementary	Grades 7-8	7 minutes
Intermediate	Grades 9-10	8 minutes
Senior	Grades 11-12	10 minutes

Time limits may be reduced if enrollment exceeds the time frame allowed for the competition.

REPERTOIRE REQUIREMENTS

Grades 7-8: In the competitive and noncompetitive sections, the slow movement of any concerto

Grades 9-10: In the competitive and noncompetitive sections, any movement of any concerto.

Grades 11-12: In the competitive section, a fast movement from a concerto.

Memorization of the selection is acceptable but not required.

One published part with all measures numbered must be provided for the judges on the day of the competition. If a photocopy must be used, the student's application must be accompanied by the NVMTA Photocopy Release, signed by a parent or teacher. Students using photocopies either for themselves or the judges without having provided the Photocopy Release by the application deadline may play for comments but will not be eligible to compete.

ELIGIBILITY

Flute, oboe, clarinet, saxophone, bassoon, or recorder students may enter.

Participants must have studied with the entering teacher as their principal teacher of the instrument played and the repertoire to be performed for the 6 months preceding the event, and the teacher must be an active member of NVMTA as of the competition entry deadline (as defined in the bylaws). No previous first place winners may compete again in the same division; but with the chairman's consent, they may compete at a higher level.

TEACHER GUIDELINES

Students must provide their own accompanist.

All parent or student questions about an event should be handled by the teacher. Teachers should never give parents or students the phone numbers or e-mail addresses of chairmen. Chairmen have no obligation to respond to parent or student inquiries.

The final decision on scheduling and related aspects of each event rests with the chairman.

AWARDS

In the noncompetitive section, students will receive comments and a rating (no ranking) from at least two judges.

In the competitive section, all performers will receive a certificate for participation. In the Elementary Level the first place winner receives \$50. The Intermediate Level first place winner receives \$100 and the first place winner in the Senior Level receives \$150. Winners at all three levels are invited to perform for the NVMTA membership.
